<u>The Native Americans –</u> <u>consequences of the European settlement</u>

Christopher Columbus

- 3rd August 1492: start of his exploration
- 12th October 1492: arrival in the new world
- He called the natives "Indians"



Relation between the Native Americans and the Europeans in the early 16th century

- First the natives taught the settlers how to grow crops (e.g. corn)
- Many new useful inventions were brought by the settlers
- They got to know new cultures
- →They lived in peace

Disputes of the Natives and the settlers

- · Settlers took the land
- They exploited them because of their raw materials
- The Whites wanted to take control over North America
- The Whites killed many animals
- → In 1814 many Indians wanted to defend their land and fought against the Whites.

Consequences of the settlement

- New diseases were brought
- · The natives lost their land
- Native languages died out
- Many "Indians" got killed in wars with the Whites
- They were forced into reservations
- They still have problems to adapt their way of living in reservations
- → many tribes died out and their culture got lost
