- **All work** has to be done **in English!** (Reading your sources and writing your paper!)
- The correct use of the **English** language and analysis of **English** sources is an **additional difficulty** compared to 'Facharbeiten' written in German.
- Your quotations and bibliography must be done according to the [Stylesheet](#) (MLA Rules).
- The final oral test that is part of your 'Facharbeit' is held **in English**.

→ **If** you do **not** like using your **dictionary**, are **not** a **quick** and **effective reader**, are **not good at scanning** lots of webpages **in English**, don't like to do **oral exams** in English,
→ **Don't** do your Facharbeit in this LK!
