### Tell us about your experiences in Poland:

# 1. The knowledge you gained (personal, social, related to the subject of our project,..)

"Staying in Poland was one of the most fascinating and amazing weeks of our whole lives. We developed our social skills and for sure our personality, because we got to know people from all five nations and we also learned to interact with strangers when the interviews took place. We obtained knowledge in regards to Poland and especially Opatow, Krakow and Warsaw.

Learning about Jewish people was very interesting; Judeo-Greek, customs, food, music, paintings, art (mandala) etc."

"During our stay in Poland we visited many different places. We had a great opportunity to make new friends. Some of our expectations were accurate, but we also learned about new aspects of Poland. All in all, living in Poland differs considerably from living in our countries. The history of Opatow is much more important for the society than the history of our hometown is for us. Because of that, it was very interesting to visit this city. The underground and also Kirshenblatt's paintings helped us to understand Polish people, especially former Jewish life.

The food in Poland is rather extraordinary. There were a lot of soups, tea, sausage and cheese. All in all we can say that most of the exchange guests liked the food, although it is completely different from the food we're used to eating.

We all got to know many new friends. We learned about their everyday-life, their situations at home and their thoughts about each other. We had great experiences in our free time, for example the campfire evening."

"This week was a good exprerience because we learned a lot of things about Polish and Jewish culture (food, culture and history). We stayed in host families, and therefore, we learned much about the polish people, for example, how they live and about their traditions."

"During this project we learned a lot of things. One of these things is that Jewish culture was, and still is, really important for Poland and also for many other coutries. We also learned a lot about coming together and working together. We got to know new people from other countries with different cultures and different views."

"We had the opportunity to learn about different cultures, customs, and to try traditional food. We also made good friendships. We expanded our knowledge in Jewish History after we visited synagogues and museums in Krakow as well as Auschwitz - Birkenau."

"Memories from Poland will stay in our hearts forever. We met new people, made new friends and came in contact with Polish families. This experience made us want to return to Poland again."

"The stereotypes that we were told collapsed; nothing was strange or surprising apart from the educational system, which is just more developed than we thought it would/could be."

#### 4. The experience in Auschwitz

"Visiting Auschwitz was mind-blowing. It made us realise that these kind of crimes MUST NEVER ever happen again! The responsibility lies with us, and by us we mean the whole world!"

"The trip to Auschwitz-Birkenau was both very shocking and impressive. We had the possibility to realize the horrors of the holocaust and to see it with our own eyes, not only from history books."

"Auschwitz is a shocking place. It was very good to see it, but it was also a very hard experience. Before we visited the concentration camp, we did an interview. Each interviewee told us their different personal stories, but we found out that they all still feel the same way about this shocking experience."

"The trip to Auschwitz was really impressive, it was also a thing we will never forget because we had never seen such a sad place and it opened our minds to what happend many years ago."
